Congratulations to Maggie McIntyre-Sloman who competed in the NSW State Basketball Championships in Tamworth. It was an amazing experience for Maggie where she learned new skills and got to compete against the best basketballers in NSW. Maggie and the other kids were also able to meet Marianna Tolo, Opals player- a huge highlight. Maggie, her teammates and competitors were chosen to compete out of 4000 students across NSW. Her Balmain Zone team won the Regional Championships and then 10 students were chosen to compete at the State Championships. Maggie's team, Sydney East placed 3rd in their pool and then 5th overall in the State. They were supported by Coach Sarah Stewart (Loftus Public School) and Manger Cassie Pentney (Ultimo Public School).

Collaborative Planning (public holiday)

Next week, our classroom teachers will be involved in collaborative planning days. Each stage team - Early Stage (Kindergarten), Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2), Stage 2 (Years 3 and 4) and Stage 3 (Years 5 and 6) - will have a full day together to evaluate their teaching and learning programs, analyse student assessment data, explore the new curriculum documents, and plan effective, student centred and evidence-based teaching and learning programs for Term 3. This is very important work, and it is important that our teams of teachers have the time together to ensure consistently high quality practice across the school.

Covid, Flu and Other Illness

As the weather continues to cool down, the best way to protect others from flu and other respiratory viruses is to **stay home when you're sick.** If you have symptoms such as fever and chills, a cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, or you just generally don't feel well, you should stay home and avoid contact with others until your symptoms are gone. If you have a child who's sick, it's best to keep them at home away from school and other activities too. If you do need to leave home when you're sick, wear a mask, physically distance, and avoid contact with people at higher risk of severe illness.

Parents and carers who have children with **persistent or ongoing symptoms** of COVID-19 are encouraged to be assessed by their local medical practitioner. These symptoms may be related to other illnesses that require treatment and management by a doctor.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions over the past few years, NSW Health has noted that some young people have missed out on non-COVID **school-based vaccination programs** that they would have taken part in. We would like to remind our parents and carers to make sure their child's vaccinations are up to date, including non-COVID vaccinations. If you are unsure about whether your child has missed any vaccinations, speak to your GP or go to NSW Health's Immunisation requirements in primary and secondary schools https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/immunisation-in-schools.aspx

Influenza is serious for children and pregnant women. An influenza (flu) vaccine is free* for children aged 6 months to under 5 years and pregnant women. The influenza vaccine reduces the risk of you and your family getting seriously ill this winter and protects your baby from influenza after birth. Everyone from six months and older is recommended to get a flu shot. Speak to your doctor, pharmacist, midwife, Aboriginal healthcare worker or Aboriginal Medical Service today. For more, visit:


