#### **Collaborative Planning**

A reminder that this week, our classroom teachers will be involved in collaborative planning days. Where teachers will have a full day together to evaluate their teaching and learning programs, analyse student assessment data, explore the new curriculum documents, and plan effective, student centred and evidence-based teaching and learning programs for Term 3.

#### **School Attendance Matters**

So far this year, there have been 285 unexplained absences from students across our school. Please remember that students should be at school unless they are unwell, or have an unavoidable appointment. If they are absent you must notify the school of the reason for the absence within 7 days of the first day they are away. You can do this via the Sentral Parent Portal, by sending an email to the school or the class teacher, or by calling the office. This allows us to provide the right support and make sure your child's absences are recorded correctly. We know that for our students every day of school matters. Missing a day here or there may not seem like much, but absences add up and can negatively impact your child's learning and wellbeing. When your child misses one day a week, that's 40 days of school and 8 weeks of learning in one year. Over an entire school journey this adds up to 2.5 years of lost learning!

Teams use the Design Thinking process to solve complex problems with empathy and collaboration at the heart.
