

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Introduction

<u>16 November 2021</u>

This report summarises the Wilkins Public School Parents and Citizens' Association (P&C) activities in the 2021 school year. It outlines the P&C's achievements in fundraising, new developments, activities of sub-committees and ways in which the P&C has built a relationships in the community and supported the schools teachers and executive.

The Role of the P&C

The role of the P&C is to assist the school in delivering the best possible educational experience for the students.

The *Education Act 1990* state that P&C Associations are established to:

- Promote the interest of the school by bringing parents, citizens, student and teaching staff into close co-operation;
- Assist in providing facilities and equipment for the school and promoting the recreation and welfare of the students at school;
- Encourage parent and community participation in curriculum and other eduction issues in schools;
- Report, when requested by the Minister, on the material requirements of the school and advice on the subject of maintenance of the school, alterations and additions to school facilities and the selection of new sites;
- Assist and co-operate with teaching staff at public functions associated with the school;
- Be responsible for the election of parent representatives to any school council constituted at the school in consultation with the Principal of the school; and
- Assist in other matters in which the Minister may seek the co-operation of the Association.

All P&C members are volunteers. Any parent, carer, teacher or interested community member is welcome to join for a one-off annual fee of \$2.

P&C Activities

2021 Started of with lots of big plans and events being organised. Then COVID returned and changed everything. But we have still been able to fundraise and support the school when needed.

Wilkins P&C is very fortunate to have a strongly supported school community and many parents and carers who have assisted in running and supporting P&C events during the year. The activities we were able to run in 2021 include:

- Running the uniform shop including ordering and stocking plus providing low cost, good quality uniforms to the school community. The uniform shop is open for half an hour on Tuesday afternoons and Friday mornings;
- Moderating the Wilkins P&C Facebook page and running Facebook groups for each year to provide forums for informal questions and social events;
- Administering the hire and repair of musical instruments to the school community and continue to fundraise for a new piano for the hall;
- Running the Wilkins Green Community Garden through managing our Garden Coordinator, contributing through working bees;
- Built relationships with the wider Inner West Schools Community through participation in the Inner West P&Cs Facebook group, and lending our equipment to other local public schools;
- Having a P&C Representative on the pre-school redevelopment project.
- Supporting our teachers with the findings of the Gallop enquiry and sharing our concerns with local member Jo Haylen. Jo Haylen then mentioned Wilkins in Parliament. - On going discussions with Jo Haylen MP and Mat Howard regarding road safety around the school. Meeting with Inner West Council, Mat Howard, local police, and relieving Principal Davida Thomas to discuss road safety.
- Supported the Breakfast Club and The Lunch club sub committee and the P&C providing the fruit and vegetables in partnership with Mayfair Fresh and sponsors per term.

Resources for the School

Our P&C continues to make an enormous contribution to the school through the work of our volunteer parents and carers and financially through fundraising.

Some funding we reserved this year has not yet been spent – we are planning to continue painting the last two toilet blocks during the summer holidays while they are not being used. In addition, we have not yet spent all of the funding for the 'wet areas'. (See treasurers report).

Wet Areas Upgrade





We have progressed further with the wet area's this year. Ceiling lattices have been installed in the upstairs wet areas. Extra pin boards were required for one of the downstairs wet areas.

The remainder of the upgrade will take place in 2022 when we know what is needed once we get the classrooms back from the pre-school.

Hand Dyers

A long term issue has been the use of paper hand towels in the school bathrooms. Paper towel has been flushed down toilets blocking them and also thrown onto the ceiling.

We have ordered hand dryers for the 13 bathrooms around the school. Another 2 were ordered to go into the bathrooms when we get the preschool area back.

Basketball upgrade



We funded an upgrade to the basketball rings in the Hall. The previous ones had nets falling off and the boards were filthy.

We also funded a scoreboard that could be used at basketball and at other school sporting activities.

Coach Ben, from Little Ballers, put in the elbow grease to clean the backboards, with the new rings they look just like new again.

Communication

Communication continues to be an area of focus for the P&C. P&C news, updates and announcements are produced weekly and included in the Wilkins Weekly – meaning that parents are able to obtain all school related information in one document. The P&C also share information through Sentral and the P&C Facebook page.

Wilkins Social Media Report

The purpose of the Wilkins Public School (WPS) P&C page is to communicate and amplify P&C, WPS and community messages. We aim to create a welcoming, friendly and supportive environment that promotes inclusivity, diversity and encourages chat and communication. We do this through posting information that is relevant to parents and carers plus we also regularly respond to private messages.

The Wilkins Public School P&C page is followed by 919 people, which has continued to increase (up from 836 last year). The page reaches an average of 1,422 people per month and has reached 9,416 people over the past year. Reach on the page is generally down due in part to the introduction of school communication tools such as Sentral, and before that School Enews, but also due to the lack of activity as a result of COVID restrictions i.e. not having events relevant to be shared with an external audience (e.g. Rock Band events, Fair Day). Reach was however up during the actual lockdown period.

In terms of specific posts, the average number of people a post reaches is 189. The highest post over the last year reached 928 people with the most viewed material being topical information or news (e.g. the principal accepting a new role), that which supports or promotes the community (e.g., the food pantry, our volunteers, Wilkins Green & Landcare) as well as some of our funnies i.e. the Wilkins Weekend Funny. However, with the average being a reach of 189 per post it is worth pointing out many posts reach only a few people. Post reach is driven by engagement with the content – comments, shares and likes.

There is a small and dedicated team of volunteer moderators who manage the WPS P&C page who without them this would not happen. An enormous thank-you to our moderators - Alice Ferguson, Naomi Burns, Kate McBean and Rachel Ayre. Rachel Ayre is the Social Media Coordinator and we are currently in need of new moderators to join our small team – please contact us by private messaging the page or emailing wilkinspnc.socialmedia@gmail.com if you would like to join us!!

Going forward we will be focusing on important information, hot topics and promoting the P&C. We will be aiming to solely focus on this key information and create greater engagement per post. This will also have the benefit of encouraging further use of Sentral for WPS news and information.

Hampers & Pantry

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer's Report

The Wilkins Public School P&C Association annual financial report is prepared for the period starting 1 October 2020 until 30 September 2021.

Revenues for the financial year totalled \$123,694 which is 40% higher than the revenue from the previous financial year. The revenue consists of income from fundraising activities, grant income, income from instrument hire, uniform shop sales and income from sales of produce from the Green.

Operating expenses for the year total of \$99,936, including the grant made to the school, resulting in profit for the year of \$23,758.

Funds at bank at the end of the year are total of \$193,943 available for to fund activities and commitments.

Our main fundraiser for the year was the Walkathon raising \$26,378. This money is in the building fund account and is allocated to the new COLA (Covered Outdoor Learning Area) being installed soon.

<u>Uniform shop</u>

The uniform shop continued operations throughout FY2021 providing the school community with convenience for uniform purchases as well as contributing to P&C income. Total uniform sales were \$57,402 with the shop making a profit for the year of \$18,480. The uniform shop result including four trading quarters is shown in the table below. As expected, the last quarter of the financial year had very little activity because of the lockdown. The online sales capability has enabled the shop to still operate well in a difficult year with the school implementing social distancing and safety measures due to Covid19. Thank you to all the volunteers who have offered up their time to run the shop successfully throughout the year.

Environmental Education

The Wilkins Green Committee remains committed to the provision of an outdoor classroom with nature-based learning opportunities, for the benefit of Wilkins students and the local community. COVID brought further challenges but continues to highlight the importance of connecting with nature and a haven from what was going on in the world. If anything it has shown how important places like these are. **Volunteer parents and community members** continue to care for the land in the heart of the Inner West.

During COVID access to the space has varied but the community garden continues to be a place families can put their energy into working in the garden. Tasks include garden bed maintenance, weed piles, garden beds, weeding, gardening, watering....This document is too short to list all the incredible contributions the community make.

The Environmental Education Program

The program ran again in 2021 with each student enjoying 1 hour per week for 7 weeks. A teacher within the school, Joanne Smythe passionately delivered the education program. Stage 3 had classes in Term 1, Stage 2 in Term 2, Stage 1 missed out in Term 3 because of COVID-19 and Kindy classes in Term 4.

Community Engagement

The Compost Collective – Wilkins Waste Warriors

The composting program at Wilkins continues with a number of families collecting their food waste. The numbers have dropped off with access being more difficult with the construction of the preschool and COVID restrictions.

Compost from cafe

Volunteer parents continue to collect food scraps from Bespoke and Grind cafe. This alone has diverted <u>1.45 tons of food waste (1450 kgs)</u> from landfill this year. This does not include the compost produced by the Compost Collective.

Wilkins Green does not buy compost. We make our own!!!

<u>Wires</u>

Wires Wildlife Rescue Aviary at Wilkins Green cared for Fig birds in the space in February. Covid has limited their ability to access the space.

GSLN Creating Canopies Project at Wilkins Green

Wilkins Green undertook the unique opportunity to join the Greater Sydney Landcare Network's Creating Canopies project, which is funded by Landcare NSW and the NSW DPIE, and valued at over \$20 000 (including in-kind contribution of ongoing voluntary labour). This partnership has enabled the careful planning, development and delivery of a large-scale natives planting project throughout the Green, with the key aims of restoring biodiversity, improving the site's resilience, contributing to cooling the city, and advancing the Green's local reputation as a unique inner-city eco-education and conservation space. With quality local provenance species selected by Inner West Council senior bush care expert Tealia Scott, and sourced from Sutherland Community Nursery and Apunga Native Nursery, nearly 900 new native mid-story shrubs, bushes and small trees were planted into the diverse zones of the Green over two stages in May and June. With our strategic site preparation of invasive weed removal and organic soil preparation, and ongoing aftercare schedule of weeding and watering, we are pleased to report a very high survival rate, which (heading into the warmer summer months) currently stands at 99%. This after-care work will continue ongoing throughout 2022 and beyond, following current best-practice methods and emerging research on urban forest regeneration.

Events

Landcare NSW chose to hold their major VIP media event at the Green's second planting event in June, with great success, where WPS principal and executives attended alongside local MP Jo Haylen. We were honoured that this event was then presented with praise in the following NSW Legislative Assembly meeting.



Working bees were held when possible on the last Sunday of the month from 2.30pm – 5.30pm. A great opportunity for adults and kids to connect and explore the space.

Inner West School Sustainable School Network meeting held at Wilkins Green in April

Wheelbarrow sales were not possible as parents weren't permitted to onsite. Volunteers instead harvested produce from the gardens and local cafe Bespoke & Grind sold them on our behalf.

Instrument Hire

The music Instrument Hire, managed by P&C again this year. This has provided a valuable access to good quality music instruments at a competitive rate for our students. The money raised from the hire is used for maintenance of the instruments and when sufficient funds available for replacement or extension of the range of instruments available. The instruments available for hire are strategically selected to provide the range required for the ensembles achieving a desired sound and are at a substantially cheaper rates than other options.

It was decided this year, that the school would take over the management of the instrument hire. All instruments are already at the school and it is less hassle for the office to manage the payments and issue instruments.

<u>Piano Fundraising</u>

During the International Family Day Breakfast BBQ we ran a raffle to fund a new piano for the school. Thank you to everyone who bought tickets.

Another important update to the shop is the uniforms are now not gender specific. We no longer have girls dresses or boys shorts, it's now dresses and shorts. Students are encouraged to wear the uniform that they are comfortable in.
